# How Do I Enroll?

- We have remote and in-person locations throughout Pike and Wayne Counties.
- Complete an intake and sign-up for a New Student Orientation. The orientation can be delivered remotely or inperson.
- Must be 18 years old and living in the United States.
- In-Person, Online, and Hybrid class options are available.
- Candidates with F-1 visas are not eligible for classes.

# **Classes We Offer:**

## English as a Second Language (ESL)

ESL Classes focus on reading, writing, listening, and speaking. We offer beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels.

## ESL for the Workplace

Classes focus on reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills that will help you at your job.

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Adult Basic Education for English Language Learners (ELLs) ABE for ELLs class is designed for students graduating from or testing out of ESL classes who need additional support in building their skills to advance to college, obtain employment, retain employment, or take their GED<sup>®</sup> test.

### General Education Development (GED<sup>®</sup>)

After improving your English, transfer to GED<sup>®</sup> classes to help you prepare for the four GED<sup>®</sup> subtests - Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science.

### Earn College Credit

Depending on your GED<sup>®</sup> score, you may be awarded NCC college credits. Credits awarded vary based on the subject passed.

### **Student Supports**

During your enrollment, you will be assigned a Student Success Specialist and a Digital Literacy Specialist. They will help you access resources in the community, set and update your goals, connect you with employment opportunities, and transition you to college.
